

Of Interest...

This month Dr. Roger Key

We've been at Carthorpe since Christmas Eve 2008 – before that Rosy & I both worked for Natural England (Government Conservation agency) in Peterborough and we still work voluntarily in nature conservation, including UK overseas territories (especially St Helena these days) and also do children's work with bugs.

Invasion of the pongy Paradoxical Leek

It's smelly leek time again at Kirklington and Carthorpe. In the next month the Green and churchyard, along with and the roadsides between and around both villages and some unfortunate people's gardens, will be covered in greeny-cream leaves and flowers of Paradoxical, or Few-flowered, Leek. (*Allium paradoxum*). Later on, the Green will be mown, releasing its pungent not-quite-as nice as garlic smell that lasts for several days. Not to be confused with the native Wild Garlic, which has much wider leaves, starry white flowers and lives in woodland, Paradoxical Leek is similarly edible, though nowhere near as pleasantly tasty as its woodland cousin. It comes originally from the Caucasus mountains and was first brought to Edinburgh in 19th century and has managed to spread right across Britain and made itself a nuisance more or less ever since. So much so that it is actually now illegal to plant it or let it escape in the wild, under the Wildlife and Countryside Act, in the same league as the infamous Japanese Knotweed, Giant Hogweed and Himalayan Balsam.

As anyone who has had it invade their garden knows, it becomes nigh on impossible to get rid of once it gets established. It suppresses the grass and can eliminate less vigorous wildflowers and garden plants. Each flower head produces not seeds, but perfect little 'bulbils', which the plant leans over and 'plants' up to a foot away, and so it spreads. Being round, the bulbils can easily roll or blow along a roadside – hence its colonization of the verges from Kirklington to Carthorpe, while mowing after it has started to flower will guarantee its spread from the bulbils amongst the mowings. Some people may be tempted to collect it and try it in their garden. Please don't - be warned! Once it's there, unless you're prepared to resort to nasty chemical treatments, you (and almost inevitably, eventually your neighbors), will have got it forever.
