Notes from the Rectory

What wrongs lie dormant in my life?

One of the most moving news items of the last month has centred around the Post Office. A story about injustice, ordinary people like you and me and a victory for the underdog. It has captured the hearts and minds of the nation for all the right reasons. Something deep within us cries out at what has happened to hundreds of innocent people, their stories containing the heart wrenching revelations: "this has ruined my life" and "I'll never be the same person again". Although, at time of writing, some still maintain that justice has not yet gone far enough, it has been encouraging to see justice brought into the limelight. Wrongs made right.

And this has led me to think about my own life. What wrongs lie dormant in my life? Wrongs that I have committed to others or that have been dealt out to me? Is there anything that continues to cause pain or guilt, eating away at me in those quiet moments? Alan Bates, the Post Office Hero, has shown to us that it is never too late to right a wrong and strive for justice. This is a fundamental Christian principal. So this February, why not gather all your courage up and face your pain or your guilt. Is there an historic argument in your life that needs a belated apology? Or is there something you need an apology for if you are to move forward?

Jesus teaches us there is always a cost for forgiveness. It may be free but it is certainly not cheap. He gave his life, but for us it may just be our pride. So let's make February the month to heal old wounds.

This month David Heaven from Burneston tells of his film-making.

I'm David Heaven from Burneston. 65 years old, now retired after working in retail, as a model maker in high class fashion jewellery, I also made the badges for the Clint Eastwood film Firefox and later 30 years as a police constable. I've always enjoyed the outdoors and photography and video, I love exploring the visual and dabbled with stereo slide film 3d in the 1980s. A keen long-distance walker, I've often been exasperated at the sheer beauty of some unspoilt locations on my travels and tried to capture with conventional cameras with their inherent limitations. The BBC's Winter Walks series inspired me to acquire a 360-degree camera which has turned out be a completely new discipline in how to film and edit. The 360 camera allows me viewpoints unobtainable with conventional cameras, but equally has its limitations. I still have to support my amateur film making with go pro and zoom cameras. Waterfalls have become my passion with over 70 captured to date. I'm not a selfie "look at me and my dogs" merchant, the location takes priority.
