The nights are long, the wind is biting and 2023 is drawing to a close. Throughout this last term I have been doing the same assemblies in all our schools. We have been looking at the A-Z of the Christian faith (If you have/know a child who attends one of the schools why not test them?!). At time of writing we are up to "I" A=Abba (not the band) B=Bible C=Cross D=Disciple

E=Eternity F=Faith G=Gospel/Good news! H=Heaven

Be like Jesus and do something beautiful and loving and new!
